The total 2021 budget appropriation will increase by \$781,547.36 over the 2020 adopted budget.

3. Explain any variances over +/-10% for each line item. Attach in FAST any supporting documentation that will help to explain the reason for the increase/decrease in the budgeted line item.

Benefits - PERS increased 12.3% and PFRS increased 18.1% due to increased employer billing. Administration Benefits - Health Insurance decreased 28.1%, Operations Benefits - Health Insurance decreased 13.7%, and Appropriations Offset with Revenue - Health Insurance decreases 23.2% as employee shares are deducted. Admin computer maintenance increases 42.3% for additional software contracts, specialized services increases 280% for employment testing, contractual services increases 25.5% for increased engineering and IT, per diem wages increases 29% for new employees, and property rental costs increase 12.3% due to increased maintenance costs. Due to increased needs auto supplies account increases 10.3%, small equipment maintenance increases 16.6%, medical supplies increase 10%, memberships increase 11.7%, and auto supplies/maintenance increases 10.3% , and Non Bondable Union Fire increased 89.8%. Specialized services increase 80% for increased volunteer incentives. Building maintenance decreases 34% as an inspection is not needed, salary & wages LTs decreases 32.8% because an employee retired. Non Bondable HVES increased 109.9% for additional computer security hardware, Admin Memberships decreased 50% because a membership is not needed, Postage was decreased 20% and safety equipment decreased 54.2% to reduce budget costs. Cost of Operations - FEMA Covid-19 Grant decreases 100% as grant was issued in 2020 but not 2021. Appropriations offset with revenue (Marine Unit) decreases 100% due to receipt of insurance claim funds in 2020. Length of Service Award Program decreases 10.4% due to expected lower costs. The total appropriations increases by \$781,547.36, or 16.4%, mainly due to the Capital Project Appropriation of \$775,842.67 for the Sprinkler Tank Project.

If Unrestricted Fund Balance is reduced by more than 10%, explain the projected impact on the following year's budget.

The amount to be raised by taxation in the proposed 2021 budget will increase by \$182,948.02 in comparison to the 2020 budget, thus causing the tax rate per \$100.0 of assessed valuation to increase to \$0.102. The District will utilize \$600,730.70 of Unrestricted Fund Balance and \$579,004.27 of Restricted Fund Balance in the 2021 budget to remain within the 2% levy cap. The Unrestricted Fund Balance is predicted to remain sufficiently funded to enable the Fire District to utilize these funds to balance future budgets. The Fire District is exploring ways to increase potential revenues, from motor vehicle accident reimbursement and for emergency medical services from insurance companies. The Commissioners will continue to strictly oversee the budget to ensure compliance and funding for the 2021 budget. The fire protection of the citizens and property owners will be the mandate of the Fire Commissioners. The Commissioners are well aware of future responsibilities to the public and will take measures to ensure public safety and compliance with state mandates.

The Fire District passed a resolution for the release of restricted fund balance on October 29, 2020 to be used in the 2021 proposed operating budget to replace an underground sprinkler tank.

The Fire District continues to pay down the debt service to Hopewell Borough Fire District No. 1 and Pennington Borough Fire District No. 1 for fire apparatus and self contained breathing apparatus. The Fire District also continues to pay down bank bonds for an ambulance, fire apparatus, and a marine unit. The Fire District finished paying off a bank bond in 2020 for an ambulance and will begin a new debt service payment to Pennington Borough Fire District No. 1 for an Engine in 2021.

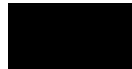
