Such amount shall be equal to the amount of the total appropriations set forth in the budget minus the total amount surplus and miscellaneous revenues set forth in the budget; and

WHEREAS, in calculating the amount to be raised by taxation, the Fire District has taken into account the assessed valuation of taxable property in the Fire District;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District, at an open public meeting held on December 8, 2022 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2023 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the Fire District's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

2. Complete a brief statement on the 2023 proposed Annual Budget and make comparison to the 2022 adopted budget.

The 2023 proposed budget included \$200k for paid EMS as a result of the closing of Pennington First Aid Squad - the largest provider of EMS services in Hopewell Valley. The proposed EMS increase will provide for one full-time fully staffed ambulance 24/7/365 in the Valley. 2023 budget also reflects an increase in anticipated revenues as a result of fee ordinances passed in late 2022.

3. **Explain any variances over +/-10% for each line item.** Attach in FAST any supporting documentation that will help to explain the reason for the increase/decrease in the budgeted line item.

A decrease in shared services resulted from the non-renewal of an existing shared service agreement. An increase in interest revenue resulted from a run rate calculation combined with the inclusion of the NJ Cash Management Account. Special Duty has decreased as a result of EMS services no longer being provided. All Fee Revenue fluctuations are the result of Ordinances that are attached to this document. Reduction in cost for Administrative Personnel resulted from the replacement of a QPA with an Administrative Assistant. Fringe Benefit costs reflect an increase in medical expenses. Other Operations has increased as a result of a contract for EMS services. Other Assets NB #1 has increased due to the purchase of computers and radio equipment. Other Assets NB #2 has decreased due to the reduction in hardware purchases. Approp. offsetting revenue - Salary and Wage has increased to include a new Fire Inspector. All other changes are statutory.

4. Complete a brief statement on the impact the proposed Annual Budget will have on the Amount to be Raised by Taxation, the use of the Restricted and Unrestricted Fund Balance(s) and how they are complying with the Property Tax Levy Cap.

If Unrestricted Fund Balance is reduced by more than 10%, explain the projected impact on the following year's budget.

The amount to be raised by taxation in the proposed 2023 budget will increase by \$201,405.74 or 4.7% in comparison to the 2022 budget causing the tax rate per \$100.00 of assessed valuation to increase to \$0.1145. The Fire District will utilize \$655,805.19 of Unrestricted Fund Balance to remain within the 2% Levy Cap. The Commissioners will continue to strictly oversee the budget to ensure compliance and funding availability. Fire prevention and protection of the citizens and property owners of Hopewell Township will be the main focus of the Fire Commissioners.
