



A Message from MERCER COUNTY CONSUMER AFFAIRS

The Mercer County Division of Consumer Affairs is a local law enforcement agency whose mission is to protect all citizens from consumer fraud via the New Jersey consumer Fraud Act and its regulations. We handle consumer complaints regarding many areas such as: home improvement, auto purchases and repairs, telemarketing, advertising, internet and identity theft. Almost all consumer transactions are regulated by Consumer Affairs.

In Mercer County and across the state, home improvement fraud is the number one complaint received from consumers. On January 1, 2006, a new law was enacted entitled "The Contractor's Registration Act". Now, before you hire any home improvement contractor (roofer, painter, driveway pavers, landscaper, carpenter, etc.) check to make sure they have a valid New Jersey Registration Number. If they are not registered, **DO NOT** hire them. Be sure to contact us before you hire any contractor to check their complaint history over the past two years.

Consumer Education is crucial to defending yourself against consumer fraud. Please contact this office at 609-989-6671 if you would like to request a consumer education program for your organization. An educated consumer is the best defense against fraud.

If you believe you are a victim of consumer fraud contact this office immediately to discuss the situation with a member of our staff and to file a complaint. Do not be embarrassed to complain. Allow your story to be told so the scheme can be identified, the culprits apprehended, the victimization of others possibly avoided and hopefully we can rectify your situation. Always save any and all evidence such as receipts, cancelled checks, invoices, contracts, etc.

Make our office your personal resource for consumer information. We are dedicated to being a consumer friendly agency and encourage you to take advantage of our services.
