Green Tip: New Jersey Home Performance with Energy Star Program. The New Jersey Home Performance with Energy Star Program offers financial incentives on energy efficient improvement packages. New Jersey homeowners now have until June 30, 2015 to receive up to \$5,000 in financial incentives. You may also qualify for 0% interest financing (up to \$10,000) to help pay for energy-efficient upgrades. The first step is to schedule an assessment (home energy audit) with a participating contractor. After the assessment, you will receive a report listing recommended measures, along with financial incentives available to pay for the work. Find out more at: NJcleanenergy.com.

State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP)

SHIP provides free help to New Jersey Medicare beneficiaries who have problems with, or questions about their health insurance. SHIP is a statewide program sponsored by the New Jersey Department of Human Services with major funding from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, the federal Medicare agency. Medicare beneficiaries frequently have questions about benefits and claims, supplement policies, and long-term care insurance. Volunteer counselors, trained in areas of health insurance coverage and benefits that affect Medicare beneficiaries, provide information and assistance for dealing with claims and in evaluating health insurance needs. This program will provide a basic outline of all Medicare programs, as well as federal and state assistance. Attendees will also learn how to get additional assistance if needed.
