Your Monthly Program Fee includes ALL of the following:

Take Charge of Your Health Care – Your own licensed Life Care Manager (available Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.) who will:

- Answer all of your health care questions.
- Help you understand your complex medical conditions, procedures and treatments.
- Follow-up with you after Capital Health doctor visits, hospital stays or emergency room visits to be certain you understand your discharge instructions, your doctor's recommendations and your care plan.
- With your permission, keep your family or loved one informed of your care plan and your doctors recommendations.
- If you are changing to a Capital Health doctor or facility, coordinate getting your previous health records sent to your new Capital Health doctor.
- Meet with a certified personal trainer in our Wellness Center who will evaluate movement patterns and recommend an appropriate weekly exercise class.

Save You Time – Your Life Care Manager will:

- Assist you in making all of your Capital Health doctor and medical service appointments.
- Coordinate and simplify the scheduling of multiple medical appointments.
- Obtain priority scheduling for your Capital Health appointments.

REASSURANCE PROGRAM

CONTACT of Mercer County, NJ offers a Telephone Reassurance program to help reduce loneliness and social isolation among older adults. It's a free daily outreach service for senior citizens who live alone. Anyone 60 and older who lives in Mercer County can sign up for the free service. A different schedule can be arranged if a call every day is too much.

The calls are typically general well-being checks, although sometimes volunteers are able to determine that a client in the Reassurance Program is in distress. Over the years, volunteers have identified clients who have fallen or had a medical emergency, and have been able to get those people the help they need.

“Our volunteers have one or two clients, and they call them every day at the same time,” Letcher says. “It’s a few minutes of conversation, but it’s also a safety check.”

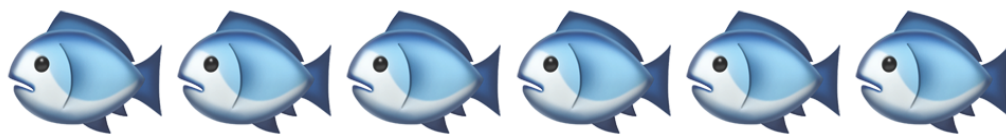

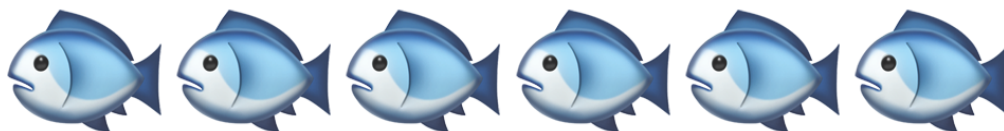


FISH of Hopewell Valley

Operation Blue Angel

The program consists of a lockbox, which will be owned and maintained by the Police Department, which will be placed by Police personnel. The lockbox will contain a key to the residence (which the resident must supply). The key will only be accessed by responding police officers in the event of an emergency where officers cannot gain access to the residence. The Operation Blue Angel program lockbox will not be accessed by anyone for any other means.

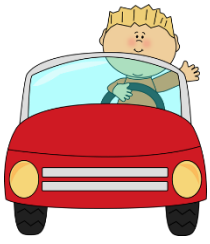

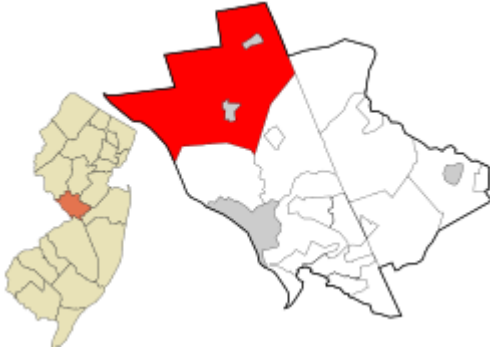
