To obtain approval, consult the chart above. This will be your guide for approval.

Applications sent via e-mail or fax or applications without the appropriate fee cannot be processed.

Certificates are valid for 6 months or until the date of closing/change in occupancy.

If there are two separate residences on the property that are being sold or rented (i.e. a cottage or garage apartment), a separate application and fee is required for each dwelling unit.

If you wish to have the Bureau of Fire Safety conduct the inspection, mail it to the Bureau of Fire Safety with the appropriate application fee, and we will contact you to set up the appointment. *Please make sure to check that the smoke and carbon monoxide alarms work and are located in the proper locations, and that you have the fire extinguisher mounted in the appropriate location before the inspector comes to your home.* **Inspections are conducted on Tuesday Mornings (9 AM - 11 AM) and Thursday Afternoons (1 PM - 3 PM). The seller or seller’s representative must be present at the time of inspection.**

If you wish to conduct a self-inspection, the seller must test the smoke alarms and confirm that all smoke alarms, carbon monoxide alarms, and the fire extinguisher are all in working order and are in the proper locations according to the guidelines above. After you have verified the above fill out the entire form, have it notarized, and mail it to the Bureau of Fire Safety with the appropriate application fee, and we will provide you with a certificate.



Example of fire extinguisher for illustration purposes only. No specific brand is required or recommended. The extinguisher shall comply with:

N.J.A.C.5:70-4.19(e) A portable fire extinguisher shall be installed in accordance with the following:

1. The extinguisher shall be within 10 feet of the kitchen and located in the path of egress;
2. The extinguisher shall be readily accessible and not obstructed from view;
3. The extinguisher shall be mounted using the manufacturer's hanging bracket so the operating instructions are clearly visible;
4. The extinguisher shall be an approved listed and labeled type with a minimum rating of 2A-10B:C and no more than 10 pounds;
5. The owner's manual or written operation instructions shall be provided during the inspection and left for the new occupant;
6. The extinguisher shall be serviced and tagged by a certified Division of Fire Safety contractor within the past 12 months or the seller must have a receipt for a recently purchased extinguisher; and
7. The top of the extinguisher shall not be more than five feet above the floor.

Kidde hard-wired smoke and combination smoke/carbon monoxide (CO) alarms

HAZARD:

The alarms could fail to alert consumers of a fire or a CO incident following a power outage.

DESCRIPTION:

This recall involves Kidde residential smoke alarm model i12010S with manufacture dates between December 18, 2013 and May 13, 2014, combination smoke/CO alarm i12010SCO with manufacture dates between December 30, 2013 and May 13, 2014, and combination smoke/CO alarm model KN-COSM-IBA with manufacture date between October 22, 2013 and May 13, 2014. They are hard-wired into a home's electric power. The i12010S and i12010SCO come with sealed 10 year batteries inside. The KN-COSM-IBA model has a compartment on the front for installation of replaceable AA backup batteries. The alarms are white, round and measure about 5 to 6 inches in diameter. Kidde is engraved on the front of the alarm. Kidde, the model number and manufacture dates are printed on a label on the back of the alarm. "Always On" is also engraved on the front of alarms with sealed 10-year batteries.

Kidde NightHawk combination smoke/carbon monoxide (CO) alarms

HAZARD:

The alarm can fail to continue to chirp when it reaches its seven-year end of life if the batteries are replaced, leading consumers to believe it is still working. This poses a risk of consumers not being alerted to a fire or CO incident in their home.

DESCRIPTION:

This recall involves Kidde NightHawk talking combo smoke/CO alarm with model number KN-COSM-IB and manufacture dates between June 1, 2004 and December 31, 2010. The alarms are hard-wired into a home's electric power. The unit has a compartment on the back for the installation of a replaceable 9V backup battery. The alarm is white, round and measures about 5 to 6 inches in diameter. "Kidde" is engraved on the front of the alarm. "Kidde," the model number and manufacture dates are printed on a label on the back on the alarm.
